Bremerton Police Department's Weekly Update

Even Troopers need a hand sometimes: On May 31, we responded to assist Washington State Patrol with a call. A pickup was stopped northbound on Highway 3 at Chico Way and a second motorist stopped to see if they needed help. The stopped truck then rammed the good Samaritan who was trying to help. The suspect then passed out while WSP was responding. Upon their arrival, the suspect began to fight with WSP troopers, and then attempted to jump off the overpass. A witness stated that the suspect was yelling that he was Jesus. The suspect was taken into custody and no one was hurt.

Patience is a virtue operating a drug house, not so much: Special Operations Group was able to serve a residential search warrant at the long time problem drug house on Rainier Avenue. Patrol and SOG have been dealing with this place for years and the neighbors have hung in there giving us great information over the last couple years. The renter has never cooperated with police and has negatively impacted the neighborhood within a couple of blocks of his house.

Detective Forbragd received credible information and from there obtained a search warrant. During the search, numerous pipes, syringes and drug related paraphernalia were located, along with a small amount of suspected methamphetamine. This is exactly what we anticipated locating at this drug-den, and it was absolutely worth the time and effort. Great work by Detective Forbragd and the rest of the SOG members.

DUI / Hit and Run: Cencom reported a possible drunk driver westbound on 13th Street from Warren Avenue. Officers checked the area, located the vehicle traveling N/B on Naval Ave from 15th Street. The vehicle had significant passenger side damage, and had been driving on a shredded front tire. The intoxicated female denied being in a collision, telling officers that she thought her "stalker" may have damaged her tire. While contacting the driver, CENCOM advised of a hit and run collision several blocks away. Officers were already following the rim marks in the road, arrived to the collision scene within a few seconds. Officer Hughes located an emblem from the suspect's vehicle that had been left in the roadway. WSP conducted fields on the female driver, and ultimately arrested her for DUI. She blew a .20 on the PBT.

DWLR 1st Degree / Possession of Meth: At approximately 0050 hours, Officer Greenhill observed a motorcycle traveling around the area of 6th Street and Warren Avenue with no lights. The motorcycle cut through the Burger King parking and Officer Greenhill was able to stop it at Broadway Avenue and 6th Street. The suspect's driver's status was Revoked in the 1st Degree. The suspect was arrested and searched. During that search, Officer Greenhill located a used meth pipe and a small baggie containing suspected methamphetamine. The suspect was booked into the Kitsap.

Holding onto drugs for other people leads to Felony warrant arrests: Officer Ejde located a felony warrant suspect at 5th Street and Park Avenue. The female had a forgery warrant out of Kitsap County. During the search of the suspect's purse, incident to her arrest, Officer Ejde located a cloth pouch containing a small amount of Heroin and related drug paraphernalia. The female reported that she was just holding the items for someone else. This seems to be a recurring problem for her.

Finally, with the help of Joe Sexton and Volunteer coordinator Tom Danaher, we kicked off the BPD volunteer program last Thursday night with a meeting of volunteers here at the department. Officer's Rivera, Whatley and Forbragd will help mentor and get the new volunteers trained. They will be in the parks and marina as extra eyes and ears as well as checking vacation homes and vacant houses to start. They will have distinctive yellow shirts that say volunteer on them, please stop and say hello when you see them out and about in the near future.
