Charleston District Center Community Workshop

Join us for a discussion about economic development initiatives in the Charleston District

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) awarded \$300,000 of Brownfields Assessment Grants to the City of Bremerton in 2017. The City is currently working with a consulting team to develop a revitalization strategy for vacant and underutilized properties in the Charleston District (along Callow Avenue between 1st and 13th Streets) to stimulate public and private investment. The City wants to engage residents at a public outreach meeting (Community Workshop) and invites all members of the community to learn more about our corridor planning project and provide recommendations on the plan's components.

The EPA defines a brownfield as, "real property, the expansion, redevelopment or reuse of which that may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant or contaminant."

How do you want the Callow Avenue Corridor to look and function?



What types of services and amenities would you like in and around the Charleston District?



What improvements would you like the community to make?
